Rules for Tuition Scholarship:

The highest scoring student or members of the highest scoring student team will be awarded a tuition scholarship for the Fall 2020 and Spring 2021 semesters at Hawai'i Community College (including Palamanui Campus).

The scholarship is worth the full amount of State of Hawai'i resident tuition for one student. All team members will equally share the amount of this full State of Hawai'i resident tuition scholarships.

A student is defined as an individual who is enrolled in Hawai'i Community College or Hawai'i Island High School during the competition phase. To qualify as a student team, all members of the team must be enrolled in Hawai'i Community College or a Hawai'i Island High School during the competition phase.

The student or members of the student team must maintain enrollment at Hawai'i Community College or be admitted to Hawai'i Community College in the following academic year and be registered for classes in order to use the tuition scholarship award.

The tuition scholarship cannot be used at any other campus within the University of Hawai'i System.
